



## The Maryland Heritage Areas Authority

The Maryland Heritage Areas Authority (MHAA), an independent unit of state government, governs the Maryland Heritage Areas Program. MHAA is chaired by the current Secretary of the Department of Planning, Rebecca L. Flora. The 19-member body consists of nine state officials and ten community and association representatives. The Authority's interagency structure encourages state agencies to work together to pool funding resources, share staff expertise, and ensure a diverse array of interests and responsibilities are factored into program governance and activities.
