Please join the Maryland Park Service and the Maryland Historical Trust for this introduction to STAMP, a public engagement program focused on documenting and monitoring shipwreck sites and following the movement of shipwreck timbers.

STAMP is part of a multi-state program in which anyone can participate. It is lead by the Florida Public Archaeology Network and data are managed by STAMP Partner agencies and organizations in Maryland, Virginia, Florida, and Texas.

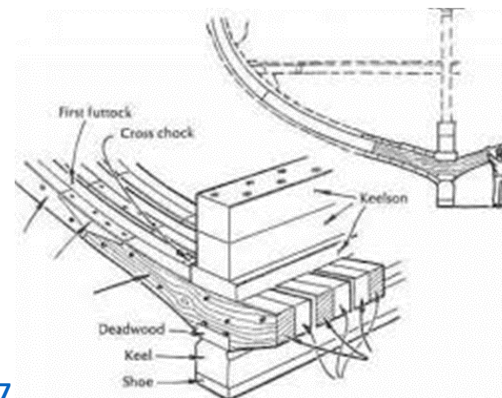
This is a perfect maritime archaeology citizen-science program; no diving required! Timbers are documented then marked with tags containing QR codes and reporting instructions. Anyone encountering a tagged timber can scan and report it using a smart phone.
