Golden Frame House, like its neighboring house down the road, is representative of a type which Henry Glassie calls the "most usual" farmhouse in the Mid-Atlantic region. The house is typical for this eastern section of Allegany County where the two entrances on the front facade is common. However, its four bays wide structure is not as common in this county as the three and five bay of facades.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Golden Frame House stands on the southern side of Scenic Route 40 at Piney Grove.

This house consists of an L-Shaped two story, four bays wide rectangular frame structure covered with insulbrick. It rests on a low stone foundation sheathed with cement with a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with corugated aluminum. Eaves consist of cornic, soffit, and bedmould. One corbeled brick chimney located inside end is original, an outside end cinderblock chimney has been added.

Two entrances are located in the center of the northern facade, one with one beveled glass light. Two over two light windows are pegged with wooden slipsills. A shed roofed frame addition has been added to the "corner" of the "L" shaped house. A hip roofed porch on the north has decoratively cut and bracketed posts.

This house, like its neighboring ^{house} one a half-mile down the road, (See AL-I-A-001) is representative of a type which Henry Glassie calls the "most usual" farmhouse in the Mid-Atlantic region.(1)

The house is at least 100 years old and is an example of architecture commonly found in southern Pennsylvania but not found that much in Allegany County where the three and five bay facade is more common.


