Milestone No. ---(149) marks / point on Mason and Dixon's West Line about 3200 feet west of the preceding monument and mound, No. ---(148), and is close to the 140th mile mark on their 1768 "Plan of the Boundary Lines" west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is <sup>very plain</sup> a new 1902 Cockeysville marble monument, of the same design as 65 other monuments set <sup>during the 1900-03</sup> /Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary west of Sideling Hill. It is in excellent condition, unaltered, measures about 10 <sup>capped by a low pyramidal top, and</sup> inches square, <sup>stands about</sup> 1½ feet above ground. The only embellishments are a blocky capital P on the north <sup>facing Pennsylvania</sup> side and M on the south side facing Maryland, the year of the original survey in this area (1766) on the east side, and the year first set (1902) on the west side. This monument is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of some 248 markers still defining the West Line, later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. Locally, as one of 27 similar new monuments <sup>of a total of 37</sup> of 1902, marking the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary, No. ---(149) is also significant as it contributes to <sup>visual</sup> the integrity of the boundary <sup>as a reminder of</sup> and the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. ---(149) marks a point on Mason and Dixon's West Line about 3200 feet west of the preceding monument and mound, <sup>No. ---(148)</sup> close to the 140th mile mark on their 1768 "Plan of the Boundary Lines" west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. It is a new Cockeysville marble monument set in 1902 at an <sup>additional</sup> site during the course of the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary; is in excellent condition, unaltered, measures about 10 inches square and stands about 1½ feet above ground.

The area here is a sparsely settled part of Lick Ridge, mostly wooded, overlooking the <sup>ravine and</sup> fork where Line Run joins Fifteen Mile Creek a short distance to the south. The site is within Election District 3 of Allegany County, MD, and Mann Towns: of Bedford County, PA; about 1½ miles due south of the small settlement of Artemas, PA; about 900 feet due east of Fifteen Mile Creek Road/T-312 at the Line and about 700 feet southeast of the entrance <sup>private lane to the</sup> to the Beisels house off T-307 (about 150 feet southwest of their new rancher); at the north edge of a dense deciduous woodlands (part of Maryland's Green Ridge State Forest). It cannot be seen from any road, any season, though easily from the Beisels drive close to the house, and is protected by the <sup>site and</sup> surrounding property owners.

The monument, as with all 1902 monuments set west of Sideling Hill except for the replica crownstone No. ---(169) in Ellerslie, is a <sup>dressed</sup> magnesian limestone post with a low pyramidal top, <sup>measures about 4½ feet long</sup> quarried and carved in Cockeysville, MD, cut to stand about 1½ feet high with about 3 feet set into the ground. The only embellishments are the blocky capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, V-sunk without serifs, with the <sup>original Mason and Dixon</sup> year of the survey on the east side (1766) and the year set <sup>by the 1900-03 Resurvey</sup> on the west side (1902), all horizontally aligned as a band near the top. The letters and dates are very clear; there are negligible nicks at the top corners; <sup>and</sup> the planes and apex of the top are well defined.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. ---(149) is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of the some 248 markers still defining Mason and Dixon's West Line, the 230.228-mile boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. This section of the West Line was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, marked with cairns the following year, and this additional site monumented in 1902 with a new Cockeysville marble marker during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of 27 similar/new monuments marking the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary, No. ---(149) is also significant in visually preserving the integrity of the boundary and as a reminder of the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.


