Milestone No. ---(152) marks a point on Mason and Dixon's West Line 146 miles and 52 chains "from the Post Marked West in Mr. Bryan's Field," **or about 143.659 horizontal miles west** of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. The large mound of stones was erected around a wood post marked W on the west side in 1767; and the original crownstone of 1767 first set ^{in 1902} as a replacement of that post, long since gone. As with all original monuments along the West Line, the crownstone is an embellished oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top and was quarried and carved in England. ^{Though firmly set and unaltered,} ~~it is in only fair condition from~~ extreme weathering, with only the Penn shield barely discernible, none of the Calvert shield recognizable, no fluting except for a bit on the west side remaining, and the top planes nearly flat from the cementing of a USC&GS triangulation station disk into the apex. It now measures about 11½ inches square and stands about 2 feet above the top of the mound, which measures about 15 feet in diameter by about 4 feet high in the center and is in excellent condition. On the national and state levels, No. ---(152) is significant primarily as among the 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments and 42½ mounds in the thematic series of some 248 markers still visually defining their West Line, the boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. Locally, as one of 37 markers (including only 8 original monuments and 9 mounds) still defining the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary, this crownstone and mound are also significant as among the diminishing number of objects and structures with an ^{readily} identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Milestone No. ---(152), an original crownstone of 1767 in the center of an original large mound of stones of 1767, is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of ¹³⁵ original monuments and ^{42 1/2} mounds of the series of some 248 markers still visually defining Mason and Dixon's West Line, the 230.228-mile boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. Preliminarily surveyed in 1766, the site was marked the following year by a wood post surrounded by a pile of stones, and ^{the survey point} permanently marked in 1902 by one of the original monuments presumably brought from the excess stones left in the vicinity of Clear Spring, MD, during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of 37 markers ^{including only} (8 original monuments and 9 original mounds) along the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary, No. ---(152) is also significant as among the diminishing number of objects and structures with a readily identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. ---(152) marks a point on Mason and Dixon's West Line 146 miles and 52 chains "from the Post Marked West in Mr. Bryan's Field" or about 143.659 horizontal miles west of the northeast corner of Maryland, the beginning of their 230.228-mile West Line. The crownstone ^{of 1767} is "the most western of the old monuments now on the boundary" (MGS Vol. 7, 1908, p. 94), and was added in 1902 to an original large mound of stones (part of a 1767 cairn erected by Mason and Dixon) during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. The crownstone is in fair condition, ^{measures about 11½ inches square by about 2 feet high above the mound, is unaltered, and presumably from the excess monuments found by the} Resurvey in the vicinity of Clear Spring, MD. The mound is original, at a site preliminarily surveyed in 1766 and marked the following year with a wood post, ^{surrounded by} and ^{a pile of} stones securing it in place. Slightly rebuilt at the time of the Resurvey, ^{in order to set the crownstone} it now measures roughly 15 feet in diameter by about 4 feet high in the center.

The area here is the very remote ^{narrow ridge and} summit of Ragged Mountain (elevation 1642 feet at the site), densely forested, and with only ^{one} ^{hunting} cabin. The site is within Election District 3 of Allegany County, MD, and Southampton Township of Bedford County, PA; about 2¼ miles northeast of the small scattered settlement of Pratt, MD; about 1600 feet west of Elbinsville Road/T-310; at a point about 360 feet west of an old ^{following the ridge} road ^{leading to} the old pipeline and about 15 feet south of the old pipeline, in the north edge of the deciduous forest. It cannot be seen from any road, nor easily from closeby, and seems protected by ^{obscurity and} this ^{remoteness}.

The crownstone, as with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments, is an oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England, and probably originally measured about 12 inches square by about 4 feet or more long, cut to stand about 3 feet high with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. When in good condition, the distinguishing embellishments are the vertical fluting with horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides and the stylized shields of the Penn family coat of arms on the north side facing Pennsylvania and that of the Calverts on the south side facing Maryland, ^{both} near the top. This monument is very badly weathered; the Penn shield is discernible but not the Calvert's; no fluting or margins remain except for a bit of fluting on the west side; the top planes are nearly gone, and a USC&GS triangulation station disk has been cemented into the apex (RAGGED 1941); and there are chips in all top corners and along all edges. However: the mound remains in excellent condition and the crownstone firmly set.


