Milestone No. ---(142) marks an irregular distance ^{Mason and Dixon's} on / 230.228-mile West Line, ^{the provincial boundary} later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. It is an original milestone ^{is an embellished oolitic limestone post} of 1767; ^{quarried and carved in} England; ^{measures about 11½ inches square} is in excellent condition, unaltered, ^{and} stands about 1 foot above ground at a new site on the Line where first set in 1902 during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. It is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments in the thematic group series of some 248 markers still defining the West Line. Locally, as one of only 8 original monuments, ^{out of 37} marking the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary, it is also significant as one of a diminishing number of objects and structures with a visually identifiable relationship to the colonial and Civil War heritage of these counties.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Milestone No. ---(142), an original milestone of 1767, marks a new site on Mason and Dixon's West Line, as established and first set in 1902 during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. It is one of eight of these original monuments found by the Resurvey in the vicinity of Clear Spring, MD, and set along this ^{Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county} part of the Line. It is in excellent condition, unaltered, ^{measures about 11 1/2 inches square,} stands about 1 foot above ground, is firmly set, and though close to the road is well protected by an old wood fencepost.

The area here is open farmland, sparsely settled, part of an ^{north-south} unnamed ridge ^{about midway} between Sideling Hill and Town Hill, ^{less than 1/2 mile west of Sideling Hill Creek.} The site is located about 1 1/2 miles northwest of the scattered settlement of Bellegrove, MD, and about 1 1/2 miles south-southeast of the ^{within Election District 1 of Allegany Co., MD, and Union Twp. of Fulton Co., PA;} area known as Barnes Gap, PA; ^{about 6 feet from the west edge of Dixon} Road/T-302, ^{which runs along the ridge} is about 3 feet above road grade level, against an old wood fencepost between two cultivated fields, in a tangled nest of blackberry bushes, well camouflaged, but can be seen from the road all seasons.

The milestone, as with all original Mason and Dixon West Line monuments, is an oolitic limestone post with a low pyramidal top, quarried and carved in England, originally measuring about 12 inches square by about 4 feet or more long, cut to stand about 3 feet high with the base left rough-cut for setting into the ground. The distinguishing embellishments are the vertical fluting with horizontally-fluted margins on all four sides, and the Roman capital letters P on the north side facing Pennsylvania and M on the south side facing Maryland, each V-sunk in the center of a plain shallow circle panel near the top. It now measures about 11 1/2 inches square and stands several ^{inches} less than its height when first set in 1902. The letters and circle panels are clear and intact; most fluting and margins remain, as do the top planes with their fluting converging at a well-defined apex. There are small ^{minor} chips along all edges and the top corners; and signs of weathering on the south and west sides.

Milestone No. ---(142) is significant on the national and state levels primarily as one of 135 original Mason and Dixon monuments in the thematic group series of some 248 markers still defining their 230.228-mile West Line, the ^{state} boundary later known as the Mason-Dixon Line, famous for its historical impact and innovative survey methods. The area was preliminarily surveyed in 1766, but the site not marked ^{with this original milestone} until 1902, during the 1900-03 Resurvey of the Maryland-Pennsylvania boundary. Locally, as one of only 8 original markers ^{of the 37} along the present Allegany/Fulton-Bedford-Somerset county boundary




