The Helmick Frame House shares the same appearance as many of the older houses on its block in Flintstone. This one is slightly larger and more elaborate; however, than the Park and Roland houses, and is believed to have been built by James and Jemima Wilson as they became more successful. The fact that the house is one of a series of homes built by the wealthy and prominent Wilson family during the mid and late 19th century proves its significance.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Helmick Frame House is located on the south side of Old Route 40 near Murley's Branch Road in Flintstone, Allegany County.

Novelty siding covers this rectangular shaped, two story, three bay wide frame structure. The southwest half of the house is adjoined by a newer two story shed roofed addition while a one story shed roof section abuts the above addition and the southeast half of the house. The original block is supported by a low stone foundation. Windows on the house are commonly double hung wooden sash frames with combinations of one over one, two over two, and six over six lights. Also found are single sash windows with both four and six lights. The main entrance faces north and has a replaced verticle paneled door with side lights. There are also entrances on the west and south sides. A tin covered gable roof sheathes the main block and features a soffit. There is a three bay front end porch supported by six Roman Doric columns and covered by a tin hipped roof. A one bay entrance porch with a hipped roof now covers the door on the southwest corner of the house. The main block has two interiorly located original corbeled brick chimneys. A new cement block chimney has been erected on the southeast corner of the house.

The Helmick Frame House stands structurally sound and is presently in very good condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Helmick Frame House is believed to have been built for James and Jemima Wilson around 1876 as a larger and more fashionable home for the prosperous couple. This property again was a parcel of ground that was inherited from Francis Robosson by his daughter Jemima Robosson Wilson. James and Jemima are believed to have originally built and lived in the Bender Frame House; however, after becoming more successful and prosperous, they moved into the larger house. The significance of this structure lies in the fact that the house is one of a series of homes built by the wealthy and prominent Wilson family between the mid and late 19th century.

The house is in near original appearance and is a cultural and architectural reminder of a way of life once found in small communities in Allegany County.¹


