The Kinton House, a two story rectangular frame block, has served numerous functions for the town of Flintstone. During the Civil War, the building was used as a store. After the war, it became the Flintstone Grange. The first floor was used as a store house while the second floor provided a meeting hall for the grange members. In 1911, the building changed hands again, when it became the Flintstone High School, the first vocational agricultural high school in the state.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old High School is located at the corner of Murley's Branch Road and Main Street, Flintstone, Allegany County.

The Old High School is a large, rectangular, frame block that is two stories high and three bays wide. At present, the building is covered with asbestos shingles. The roof is gabled with a boxed cornice and returns and a soffit and is covered with asbestos shingles as well, with the exception of a modern "picture" window. The windows in the structure are six over six lights with plain trim. The entire building rests on a replaced cement block foundation. Entrances can be found on the north, east and west sides and feature paneled doors with replaced hardware. Two corbeled brick chimneys are located in the inside gable ends of the building.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Kinton House has served numerous functions for the town of Flintstone. During the Civil War, the building belonged to Dr. Thomas Perry Robosson who used it as a store. After the war, the building was used as the Flintstone Grange. The first floor was used as a store house while the second floor provided a meeting hall for the grange members. In 1911, the building changed hands again, when it became the Flintstone High School, the first vocational agricultural high school in the state.¹


