DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Rice Stucco House is located on the north side of Main Street, Flintstone, Allegany County.

The Rice house is a two story, two bay wide, rectangular building with a single bay shed roof addition on the east side. At present, the house is covered with insul brick; however, the original covering was stucco. The roof is gabled with a soffit and covered with tin. Windows in the structure are double hung wooden sash frames with six over six lights. The entire structure, with the exception of the addition, rests on a low stone foundation. The main entrance, which is covered by a two bay end porch with a hipped roof, features a paneled door with replaced hardware. A single replaced brick chimney is located at the outside end of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Rice Stucco House was probably constructed in the 1870's for John McKelfish and his wife. It is unique in that it is one of the only buildings that has been surveyed that is constructed of stucco. At present the stucco is not visible since the house was covered with asbestos shingling some time in this century. The house is in fair condition and retains much of its original fabric and appearance.




