**Description of Property and Eligibility Determination:** *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Robosson Log House was constructed in the late 18th century when Elijah Robosson, Jr. (1758-1842) moved to Allegany County. Robosson, Jr. settled on land which had been purchased by his father, Col. Elijah Robosson (1731-1797), a resident of Anne Arundel County. The tract of land was known as "Flintstone" and on it Elijah built a two story log cabin. In 1797, the year of his death, Col. Elijah Robosson sold his son the "Flintstone" tract containing 803 1/2 acres and a second tract known as "Content" which contained 240 acres. A year later Robosson, Jr. moved to Allegany County with his bride, Anne Talbot Robosson. The couple had eight children and eventually returned to Anne Arundel County. However, three sons, John, Francis, and Thomas, remained in Allegany County. The original farm remained in the hands of Thomas Robosson and his wife Emeline Perry. Eventually the property was inherited by his son, Dr. Thomas Perry Robosson. Today, almost one hundred years later, the property is still inhabited by the Robosson family.

Architecturally, the building is a two story log mansion with two brick outside end chimneys. Two additions abut the main block on its northern side. One is the original smoke house and the second is the summer kitchen (also with an outside end chimney) which provided slave quarters on its second floor. The slave quarters as well as numerous outbuildings are two indications of the substantial wealth of the Robosson family.

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**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Robosson Log House is located on the north side of Route 40, Flintstone, Allegany County.

The Robosson House is a two story, three bay wide rectangular log structure that has been covered with asbestos shingles. Two rectangular additions abut the main block on the north side. The house is supported by a low stone foundation. The roof is gabled with visible rafter ends, and is covered with tin. Windows are a combination of six over six and two over two lights with pegged double hung wooden sash frames. The main entrance is paneled with a transom and is covered by a replaced three bay end porch. The porch has a hipped roof and is supported by square columns. A second shed roof porch is located on the north side at the inside gable ends.

In addition to the farm house, numerous outbuildings are also located on the property. In general, these are constructed of board and batten with stone foundations.

ROBOSSON LOG HOUSE: Built in 1797 by Elijah Robosson, Jr., this log dwelling is typical of late eighteenth century houses in Allegany County. It consists of a main block of two stories, three bays on the long axis, with a gable roof. The porch which runs along the first story front has a half-hipped roof, and there are two small additions along the north (rear) wall. There are two brick internal end chimneys. The house is sided with asbestos shingles.


This indenture made 18th of October 1779 between Messuers Joseph Selby and John Howard, both of the City of Annapolis in the State of Maryland, gentlemen of the one par, and COL. ELIJAH ROBOSON of Anne Arundel County and State aforesaid of the other part. Witnessst that the said Joseph Selby and John Howard for and in consideration of the sum of 2,782 Pounds and 10 Shillings current money to them in hand paid by the said Elijah Robosson before-----all that tract or parcel of land called and known by the name of "Flintstone" lying and being in Washington County----- containing and now laid out for 742 acres of land more or less - - - - /.

Deed - Recorded Allegary County Court House, Cumberland, Maryland.  
Liber Q Folio 528 Note: This copy of the deed was not recorded in the Allegary County Court Records until 1834.

Elijah Roberson, Sr., Esq., of Anne Arundel Co., Md. sold to Elijah Roberson, Jr., of Allegary Co., Md., farmer, for 300 pounds, a tract called "Flintstone" and "Resurvey on Flintstone", originally granted to John Howard and Joseph Selby, bought in 1790 by Elijah Roberson, Sr. and containing 803 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres. Also, a tract called "Content" containing 240 acres, originally surveyed for Thomas Bladen on Town Creek. Signed Elijah Robosson. Mary Robosson agreed.  
Recording fee: 52 pounds of tobacco.

Deed - Recorded Allegary County Court House, Cumberland, Maryland.  
Liber B Folio 268 Note: At this time, recorded, Jan. 25, 1797, Elijah Robosson, Jr. was a residence of Allegary Co., Md. Elijah Robosson, Jr. moved to Carroll County, Md. before 1840. His will was made Nov. 19, 1840 in Carroll Co., Md. and probated January, 1842. In this will he bequeathes unto his grandson, Thomas Perry Robosson of Allegary Co., Md., the land called "Flintstone" and "Resurvey on Flintstone". This property has been owned by the Robosson family since 1779. The following is a list of owners:

- \* Thomas Perry Robosson became a doctor. He practiced for ~~some~~ time in the old log house. Later, his office was located in a brick house that he built in Flintstone.


