A tall, sturdy, sandstone chimney is all that remains of the original stone house that was built on site in 1787. The house was probably two stories tall, and had a singular fireplace opening which would have served the first floor. Stone from the house was dismantled in 1941 by James Kerr, and was incorporated into a stone wall enclosing the driveway of a home built in LaVale.

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## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Stone House that once surrounded the remaining chimney ruins on the Wallizer property was built in 1787. The house was probably two stories tall, and had a singular fireplace opening which would have served the first floor.<sup>1</sup>

Stone from the old house was dismantled by James Kerr in 1941. Kerr had the building materials transported to LaVale where they were incorporated into a stone wall enclosing the driveway of a home he built from 1941 to 1942. That home is located at 1001 Weires Avenue in LaVale and is now occupied by Mr. James Schell.<sup>2</sup>

The Old Chimney Ruins are located on the east side of Town Creek Road approximately one mile south of Route 40.

This tall sandstone chimney is all that remains of the original stone house that was built on the site in 1787. The stone in the chimney was constructed in a sturdy fashion with a random ashlar pattern. Mortar was of the clay-mud type. There is only one fireplace opening in the chimney, and it's located on the north side and would have served the first floor.


