

STICKLEY HOUSE and BIG SPRING

ca. 1870

The Stickley House basically consists of a two story, three bay wide, "L" shaped frame structure. The house was probably constructed circa 1875 and is typical of rural farm architecture in Allegany County in the late 19th century.

The Big Spring is located only several yards west of the house and pours from the base of a limestone cliff. A small board and batten spring house is located adjacent to the mouth of the spring.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Stickley House and Big Spring is located on the east side of the Williams Road in Rush, Allegany County, near the Jamison Road inter-section.

The house basically consists of a two story, three bay wide, "L" shaped frame structure. A one story shed roof wing abuts the main block at the apex of the "L". The entire facade is covered with novelty siding and the frame is supported by a low stone foundation. Windows in the structure include pegged, double hung wooden sash frames with two-over-two lights and ornamental pediments. The roof of the main block is gabled and is covered with replaced asphalt materials. Eaves of the roof exhibit boxed cornices with a wide soffit and return ends. Circular ventilators are placed in the peaks of the gable ends. A single main entrance is located on the front northern side and features a replaced two panel door with an ornamental pediment. A hipped roof hood is placed over the entrance-way and is supported by square columns and brackets. A shed roof porch is located on the east side and is supported by four square columns. Two original brick chimneys are located to the interior of the house while a replaced cement block chimney is located on the interior of the rear portion.

A large spring is found on the property at the base of a limestone cliff. A small board and batten spring house is built adjacent to the mouth of the spring.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Stickely House is one of a large group of farms and farmhouses located east of Cumberland near Flintstone. The house was probably constructed ca. 1875 and is typical of rural architecture in Allegany County in the late 19th century.

The house is unusual in that it has a large spring on the property which pours from the base of a limestone cliff. Near the mouth of the spring is a board and batten spring house. Outbuildings such as a spring house were necessities in that the farm had to maintain itself as a self-sufficient environment.


