Early 20th Century

The Street Farmhouse was built by Holliday Street in the late 1890's. Prior to the building of this house, the Streets had occupied an adjacent log house since 1833, which was constructed early in the first decade of the nineteenth century by a member of the Robinette family. (See AL-II-A-124)

When compared to the old log homestead, this frame house reflects the increased prosperity and more comfortable living conditions of farming families at the end of the nineteenth century.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Street Farmhouse is located at the end of Street Road on the eastern side of Martins Mountain near Flintstone.

This late nineteenth century farmhouse was originally constructed in an "L" shape, three bays wide and two and a half stories tall. Porches on the eastern facade and in the corner of the "L" have been enclosed. Wall construction is frame with German siding.

The building rests on a high cement foundation with a plain water table. The gable flank roof of ribbed tin has snowbirds. The eaves consist of a box cornice, sloped soffit, and frieze.

Wall features include cornerboards. Two brick chimneys are corbeled and hooded. One is located inside end, the other is on the northeastern corner.

Entrances have been obscured by the enclosure of the porches. One over one light windows are nailed with a simple pediment and wooden lugsills.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Street Farm House stands at the Mason-Dixon Line on the eastern side of Martins Mountain.

The Street Farm had been occupied by that family for approximately sixty-five years when Holliday Street built this frame house. <sup>(1)</sup> Since 1833, the Streets occupied an adjacent log house which was constructed early in the first decade of the nineteenth century by a member of the Robinette family. (See AL-II-A-124)

When compared to the old log homestead, the frame house reflects the increased prosperity and more comfortable living conditions of farming families at the end of the nineteenth century.
