The Street Log House, located at the Mason-Dixon Line on the eastern side of Martin's Mountain, was constructed early in the nineteenth century by a member of the Robinette family, original settlers of the area. The farm that in 1833 became Thomas Street's residence was occupied by the Street family for over one hundred years. A frame farmhouse was built adjacent to the log house by Holliday Street near the turn of the century. (See AL-II-A-123) Although in ruinous condition, Street Log House is representative of the simple homes of the settlers of Western Maryland, who used the locally traditional log construction technique of "V" notching.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Street Log House is located on the eastern side of Martin's Mountain at the end of Street Road near Flintstone, Maryland.

Although in ruinous condition, the building retains its original design. It is rectangular, three bays wide, and two stories tall. Wall construction is of ten inch thick squared logs with "V" notching.

The low foundation is made of random rubble. The gable flank roof, which has collapsed, is of ribbed tin. The eaves consisted of a simple overhang.

Two entrances located in the center of the eastern and western facades are of vertical boards. Windows are six over six lights, pegged with wooden slipsills.

A shed porch the length of the eastern facade was supported by round posts. It is partially collapsed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Street Log House stands at the Mason-Dixon Line on the eastern side of Martin's Mountain. It was constructed early in the first decade of the nineteenth century by a member of the Robinette family, original settlers of the area. ⁽¹⁾ An 1833 agreement in which Nathan Robinette sold the place to Thomas Street identifies the property as the "Tract of land on which Asa Robinette's widow now lives..." ⁽²⁾ Nathan Robinette had made many purchases of land within the same tracts around 1801. ⁽³⁾

The farm that in 1833 became Thomas Street's residence was occupied by the Street family for over one hundred years. ⁽⁴⁾ A frame farmhouse was built adjacent to the log house by Holliday Street near the turn of the century. (See AL-III-A-123)

Using the locally traditional log construction technique of "V" notching, Street Log House is representative of the simple homes of the settlers of the mountains and valleys of Western Maryland. Log construction was particularly popular in this area due to the accessibility of abundant forests providing cheap and functional building material.

Although in ruinous condition, Street Log House is physical evidence of the craftsmanship of the early builders and settlers of Allegany County.


