

Hartsock Brick Farmhouse

The Hartsock Brick Farmhouse is aptly named since it has been owned by the Hartsock family since it was built. Fred Hartsock bought the property in 1865, and the house was built within a year afterwards, according to present owner, Mrs. Lewis Hartsock. Mrs. Hartsock also remembered that her husband's father had carried bricks made on the farm to build the house. The Hartsock farmhouse is similar to other brick farmhouses in northeastern central Allegany County. All the houses are "L" shaped and are built with the locally rare Flemish bond brickwork on the main facades. The house retains its original appearance and is a reminder of the prosperity once enjoyed by a family in this rural area of Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Hartsock Brick Farmhouse is located on the northern side of Hardsock Road near Flintstone.

The building is an "L" shaped structure two stories tall and three bays wide. Wall construction is of brick laid in Glemish bond on the eastern facade and American common bond laid in a variation of five to one elsewhere.

The building rests on a high foundation of random ashlar stone with raised joints and a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with tin. Eaves consist of a box cornice, soffit, bed mould, and returns. Three original corbeled brick chimneys are located inside end.

The main entrance in the center of the eastern facade has original hardware and a wooden lintel. Six over six light windows are pegged and have wooden lintels and slipsills.

A frame addition covered with aluminum siding abuts the stern of the "L" on the west.

A hip roofed front porch has plain wooden posts, railing, and balusters. A shed roofed porch on the west has plain wooden posts.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hartsock Brick Farmhouse is aptly named since it has been owned by the Hartsock family since it was built. Fred Hartsock bought the property in 1865, and the house was built within a year afterwards. (1) The house's present owner, Mrs. Lewis Hartsock, says that her husband's father remembered carrying bricks to build the house. (2) She also states that the bricks were made there on the site. (3)

The Hartsock farmhouse is one of several similar brick farmhouses built around the mid-1800's across the north of east-central Allegany County. (See AL-III-C-126) The houses all have the same "T" shape and are built with the locally rare Flemish bond brickwork on the main facades. The house retains much of its original appearance and is a reminder of the prosperity once enjoyed in this rural area of Allegany County.


