The Allen Frame House is a typical example of rural architecture in Allegheny County. Like many other houses in the County it is two stories high, three bays wide with a gabled roof. Circular ventilators decorate the gable ends, and two original corbeled brick chimneys are present on inside ends of the house. Windows are double hung wooden sash frames with two over two lights and cornices. Overall, the house appears to be conservatively influenced by the Italianate style, which was predominant in Allegheny County during the second half of the 19th Century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Allen Frame House is located on Main Street near the intersection with Greenspring Road in Oldtown, Allegany County, *Ok the North side of street.*

The Allen House is a two story, three bay wide "L" shaped structure covered with weatherboard. The entire building is supported by a low stone foundation that has been covered with cement and has a plain water table. The roof is gabled and covered with tin. Small circular ventilaters ornament the gable ends. The windows are double hung wooden sashes with two over two lights and cornices. The main entrance is located on the main facade and is covered by a hip roofed porch. A second entrance also covered by a porch is located at the apex of the two wings. Two corbeled brick chimneys are located at the inside ends of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Allen Frame House, located on Main Street in Oldtown, Allegany County is a typical example of rural architecture in Allegany County. In all probability it was constructed in the latter half of the 19th Century. Like numerous other houses in the county it is two stories high, three bays wide with a gabled roof. Also typical of homes built in the vernacular tradition are the two circular ventilaters located in the gable ends. The predominant architectural style in Allegany County during the second half of the 19th Century was the Italianate. The vernacular tradition would seem to be a more tailored or conservative version of this style.




