The Athey Log House stands on a tract known as "Monte Notte" which was farmed by the Athey family for close to one hundred years. The house was built during the first quarter of the 19th century and is typical of the type of one room log cabins which were constructed in Allegany County during the early years of settlement. As such, it has "V" notching and a large stone outside end chimney. The roof is steeply gabled to provide better drainage and thus prevent the building from rotting. Chinking in the house is composed of a combination of mud and straw.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Athey's Log House is located on Manifold Road at Town Creek Ford.

The square structure is one story tall with a loft, and has only one room. Walls are made of logs but have been covered with weatherboarding, which is starting to fall off of the facade. Notching is not visible on the corners of the house, but was probably similar to the V notching on the nearby log springhouse. The house sits on a foundation of stone pilings. The east side of the house has a single sash wooden frame window with one light. Two other windows are found on the structure, and they are replaced double hung wooden sash frames with three over one lights. The east facing front entrance includes the original vertical paneled door. Rafter ends are visible below the tin covered gabled roof. There has been a recent single story shed roof addition built which abuts the southerly side of the house. Featured is one original stone outside end chimney on the north side.

Athey's Log House is presently in deteriorated condition exteriorally, but is composed of a sturdy timber frame.




