The Rice House is of particular significance in that it encompasses a 18' x 24' log structure that was once the original structure on the property. The land on which the house stands was originally granted to Michael Collier on May 23, 1793 and was known as "Collier's Discovery". Two major additions have been added to the original structure so that it is now no longer visible from the exterior, and instead the house has the appearance of a farmhouse built in the "vernacular" tradition of Allegany County.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Rice's Orchard Frame & Log House is located on Route 51 just northwest of Spring Gap, Allegany County.

Although the Rice house has gone through many transformations, it is presently a large rectangular structure four bays wide and two and a half stories high. The original structure was an 18' x 24' log building which is now located in the right hand rear portion of the building and is covered with weatherboard.<sup>1</sup> This part of the structure, in all probability, dates from the late 18th Century.<sup>2</sup> A somewhat later frame addition makes up the main facade and is also covered with weatherboard while the most recent addition which abuts the log section in the rear of the building is frame covered with asbestos shingles. The roof is gabled and is covered with asphalt shingles. Several low cross gables are placed both along the main facade and the northeastern side of the structure. There are a number of rectangular ventilaters set into the gable ends. The entire facade is supported by a low stone foundation with a plain water table. Entrances are located on the front and western sides of the building and contain replaced doors and hardware. Windows in the structure are one over one lights and the main facade is interrupted by two single story bay windows. The main entrance is covered by a four bay porch with a flat roof and supported by Roman Doric columns. A second enclosed porch with a hipped roof is located on the rear westerly portion of the building. One corbeled brick chimney is located in the interior of the main building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although Rice's Frame & Log House does not differ that much from the majority of farmhouses built in the latter half of the 19th Century in Allegany County, it is of special importance in that part of the house is an 18' x 24' log section that in all probability dates to the late 18th Century. The land on which the house stands was originally granted to Michael Collier dated May 23, 1793, and was known as "Collier's Discovery". Collier was to sell the land two years later to Jacob Slagel of Hampshire County, Commonwealth of Virginia. Since the property remained in the Slagel family for some time following this transaction it is possible that Jacob Slagel or some member of his family built the original log structure.<sup>1</sup>

As is evident from the physical description, this original log structure has had two major additions and is now no longer visible from the exterior. From all records, the property seems always to have been used as a farm and most recently (1911) the land was used as an orchard by the Rice family.<sup>2</sup>

The Rice Frame and Log House, despite the fact that the log section is no longer visible, is nevertheless a good example of the changes that time and economy can make on what may have been a temporary log structure built by a member of the Slagel family who came up from Virginia to survey their lands.
