MASON DAVIS DAIRY FARM
Route 51, South east of Cumberland
Late 19th Century

The Mason Davis Dairy Farm House is a large two and a half story, four bay wide structure of Queen Anne Styling. The building is covered with novelty siding and rests on a high cut stone foundation. Asphalt shingles cover the gabled roof (with pediments), which supports one gabled roof dormer on the east side. The northeastern corner of the house features a two story bay window. Windows are double hung wooden sash frames with one over one lights and cornices. The property was used as a dairy farm and contains six outbuildings and a spring; they include a tool shed, wagon shed and corn crib, meat house, barn, milk house and chicken coop.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Mason Davis Dairy Farm is located on Route 51, ^{2.1 Miles} ~~just~~ south-east of Cumberland, Allegany County, on the West side of the Rd.

The Mason Davis Dairy Farm is a large rectangular structure that is two and a half stories high and four bays wide. The building is frame and is covered with novelty siding. The entire structure is supported by a high cut stone foundation with a plain water table. The roof of the structure is gabled and is covered by replaced asphalt shingles. A single dormer is placed along the front of the roof line directly above the second story windows. The windows are all double hung, pegged wooden sash frames with cornices and one over one lights with the exception of the two windows which are set into the foundation which are six over six lights with plain trim. The main facade is interrupted on its western end by a bay window which extends two stories from the roof line to the porch. The main entrance is located on the northern facade and consists of a paneled door with a transom light. This entrance is covered by a 4 bay porch supported by brackets and turned supports and is surrounded by a railing composed of turned ballisturs. One corbeled brick chimney is located within the facade.

The Davis Dairy Farm also includes numerous out-buildings including a log wagon shed and corn crib- which was, at the time, covered with weatherboard. The house and out-buildings are in fair condition but as the farm is no longer occupied, the buildings are deteriorating somewhat more rapidly than normal.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Mason Davis Dairy Farm was built in the late 19th Century and originally belonged to J. W.H. Pollock and his wife Hannah. The Pollocks bought the property in 1887. Although the house is in fair condition and typical of the Queen Anne style, perhaps the most interesting thing about the Davis Farm is its outbuildings. The land was used as a dairy farm and the service buildings include: a milk house; a barn; meat house; wagon shed and corn crib. The milk house has a gabled roof with a boxed cornice and returns as well as a corbeled brick chimney.

With the exception of some of the outbuildings, the Mason Davis Farm is in fair condition and retains much of its original fabric and appearance.






