DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Miller Log House is located on the west side of Brice Hollow Road near Mt. Tober, Allegany County.

The house basically consists of a two story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped log structure that has been covered with aluminum siding. A two story shed roof wing abuts the main block on the west side, and a one story, shed roof porch adjoins the wing on the south side. The entire facade is supported by a low stone foundation with a plain water table. The roof of the main block is gabled and is covered with tin materials, while the eaves exhibit simple boxed cornices. Windows in the building feature replaced double hung wooden sash frames with two over-two lights and plain trim. The main entrance is located on the front east side and includes a replaced paneled door. A three bay replaced end porch is placed on the front eastern side. The porch features a hipped roof which is supported by wrought iron columns and balustrade. A straight flight of stairs leads to the entrance level. One original brick chimney is located on the inside end of the south side.

The house is structurally sound however it has been somewhat altered since original construction.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Prior to 1825, the log cabin was the most popular form of housing in Allegany County. Since log cabins were economical to build, easy to construct and sturdy, this popularity was to continue throughout the first half of the 19th century.

The Miller House is typical of the type of log building that was constructed prior to 1850. It is a large two story structure and is what is known as a "log mansion". It is impossible to tell anything about the chinking or the notching since the building has been covered with aluminum siding. Since the house is located in the fertile farming region east of Cumberland, it may have originally provided shelter for a subsistence farmer and his family.


