DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Heavner Farm is located on the Jamison Road west of Rush in Allegany County.

The Heavner Farm house is a two story, five bay wide rectangular frame building. A two story frame addition abuts the main block on the southwest side. The entire house is covered with weatherboard and rests on a low stone foundation. The roof is gabled with a boxed cornice and returns and has been covered with tin. Windows in the house are double hung, pegged, wooden sash frames with six over six lights. The majority of windows are flanked by louvered shutters. The main entrance is located on the northwest facade and features a door with four verticle panels, original hardware, recessed side lights and transom light. The main entrance is covered by a one bay entrance porch. The porch has a gabled roof with a boxed cornice and returns and is supported by replaced brick columns. A second shed roofed porch is located on the west side of the rear addition. Two original corbeled brick chimneys are located in the inside gable ends of the main block.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Heavner Farmhouse was constructed during the first half of the 19th century and is one of a large group of farmhouses, barns, etc. located in the farming region of eastern Allegany County. The house is of special interest in that it is very similar in both size and mode of construction to several other farms in the area. (See Historic Sites Inventory AL-II-A-076 and AL-II-A-081). All three houses are large "L" shaped frame buildings with gable roofs and six over six lights and brick end chimneys all which are typical of antebellum architecture in Allegany County.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house remains in its original appearance constructed in a L shape, covered with over lapped boards, three rooms, hall on the first floor and four bedrooms. The old roof of wooden shingles was replaced with a metal one. In the basement, entered from an outside trap door, hand hewn log beams are exposed. Hand made bricks fill in the space of the jointed and pegged frame. The front door has the small windows surrounding it, and the large iron lock. The back section of the house, on the eastside, has two porches, one up and one down. (The lower closed to give additional room to the kitchen). The house has the original shutters and iron ware and twelve light windows. The interior has been changed by removing a few partitions to enlarge the rooms. It has the original molding, and five (5) fireplaces, and all the original flooring.

Barn

The original barn remains with the hand hewn timber, mortised and pegged together.

This transaction is recorded in Liber 4 Folio 507 dated 1848 and Liber 17 Folio 164
dated 1858. Francis Jamison predeceased Henry A. Jamison so the above farm is
also referred to in the will of Henry A. Jamison - Will Liber C Folio 92 Probated
4/2/1867 and the Court of Equity Case No. 1651, dated 9/28/1867.

The farm was left to Eliza Jamison, wife of Francis A. Jamison, conveyed to Eliza
A. Jamison from William Walsh, Trustee, Dated 1/31/1879 - Liber 57 Folio 588

Eliza A. Jamison departed this life intestate on February 4, 1903.
Her son, Charles B. Jamison and other heirs deeded the property to George Eston
Dolly, February 28, 1920.

Zella J. Weires received the property from her family (the Dolly family).


