DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The former academy building, constructed circa 1850, and now a residence, is located on the south side of Rocky Gap Road, with its principal facade facing north. It contains two sections, the larger western gable-roofed main building, with a smaller building attached to its southeast corner. The main block is one story high, with a gable end facade, and is constructed of brick now painted white. It is three bays wide, with a central doorway with sidelights flanked by a 6/6 window to each side.

A later one-story porch supported by tapered piers on square bases extends along the main facade and wraps around the east side, connecting to the smaller building on the southeast corner and giving the building a bungalow flavor. The smaller building is two bays wide by two bays deep, with a door and window in its north wall and two windows on the east. It is also of brick painted white, and has a pyramidal roof which contributes to the interesting sequence of rooflines on the building.

— Addendum to AL-III-C-087 Old Union Grove Academy

This addendum to the Maryland Historical Trust Inventory Form, completed in 1979, is based on correspondence with Jack Smouse in October 1990.

Land records listed the academy as the "Wilson Academy" in 1902 when the Board of County School Commissioners of Allegany sold the property to the Smouse family. Recorded in Allegany County deed Liber 91, Folio 406 dated August 9, 1902.

The correct address is the south side of Smouse's Mill Road.

The county purchased the land in 1874 and constructed the building the same year. A date stone in the building gives the date 1874 and initials J.J.S. (John Jacob Smouse).

The gable roofed building faces east with a smaller building attached to its southwest corner. The one-story porch extends the length of the main facade and wraps around the south side of the building.




