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### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is two stories high, three bays wide by one deep, and faces east. It is clad in novelty siding, with a tarred standing-seam metal roof.

The principal (east) facade has a central entrance flanked by 2/2 sash windows. Three 2/2 windows on the second floor are aligned over the openings below. Window and door openings are enriched with moulded cornices. A central gable holds a small square window. A one story porch with Colonial Revival columns and modern iron railing spans the facade.

Both gable ends have a single 2/2 window on each story. A modern exterior chimney rises against the north gable.

A two-story, gable roofed ell extends from the rear. This ell is two bays wide, with an entrance in the south facade sheltered by a porch with turned posts, and a one-story shed-roofed addition on the north side. An interior end chimney exits from the peak of the gable on the west.

There are several outbuildings including a summerhouse and a number of small sheds, all in good repair and contemporaneous with the house.


