DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This house is two stories high, five bays wide by one deep, and faces east. There is a three bay ell at the rear - probably an earlier structure - the ridge of whose roof rises to the level of the eaves of the main roof. The building has been extensively modernized with 1/1 sash and aluminum siding, but retains the general form of a late - 19th century farmhouse. The central entrance has a modern door with a three-light transom, under a half-hipped, one-bay portico. Fenestration is symmetrical and evenly spaced. Centered in each gable is a picture window, with tall sidelights on the first story, with a 1/1 sash above. There is a modern external fireplace and chimney at the northwest corner.

Across the road stands an unusual two-bay outbuilding, square in plan with a complex roof with intersecting gables. This building is clad in bevel siding. There are several large modern dairy barns on the property.


