DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house on the Col. William LaMarr Farm is of brick construction, two stories high, five bays wide by two bays deep, and is located atop a small hillock facing north. On the principal (north) facade, a one-story porch supported on turned columns shelters the transomed entrance which is located in the central bay, flanked on either side by two 6/6 sash windows. Five 6/6 windows on the second story are aligned above the first-floor openings. The east gable has two 6/6 windows on each floor, flanking an exterior chimney, while an interior chimney rises from a point halfway up the front slope of the west gable. The roof is covered with standing-seam metal. A recent, flat-roofed basement-level addition adjoins the building on the east, and a low, shed-roofed addition extends to the rear. The house could not be approached for close examination.

A large, east-facing frame barn with an unsupported forebay stands across Miller Road, northwest of the house.

Col. William LaMarr (1755-1837) who settled in Allegany County after distinguished service in the Revolutionary War and became one of the largest landholders in the area, purchased the 82-acre tract known as the Lawrence Enlarged on March 19, 1808, and added 48 acres to this parcel on March 20, 1815.


