The Malamphy house is a log house which was rebuilt in the 1950's. The "L" shaped original stood on the Christie Road near the Knights of Columbus, but it was dismantled and rebuilt at its present location. Logs on the southwest of the building were spliced together to create the addition to the building. The structure is large for a log house, and it belonged to the Beall family, an early farming family of eastern Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Malamphy Log House, on the southern side of Neal Road near Cumberland Country Club, is a rebuilt log house. The "L" shaped original stood to the east, near Christy Road, but was dismantled and rebuilt at the present location. In its rebuilt form, the building is a larger square; logs on the southwest were spliced together to create the addition. Only the "V" notched logs of the original were reused.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Malamphy house is a log house which was rebuilt in the 1950's. The original house was "L" shaped and it stood on the Christy Road near the Knights of Columbus, according to the present owner, Hugh Malamphy. (1) The Malamphy family has owned this property since the late 19th century. (2)

The house belonged to the Beall family, an early farming family of eastern Allegany County. (3) The Bealls were apparently fairly prosperous because the house is large for a log house.


