

Robinette Log Cabin
AL-111-C-135
Valley Road
near Cumberland
ca. 1860

This log cabin is representative of a popular form of housing for western Maryland residents in the 18th and 19th centuries. The "Little Valley Farm" was purchased by Solomon Rice in 1860, and this cabin was probably built shortly thereafter. The farm has been owned by the Robinette family for eighty years, since 1899. The original log cabin has "V" notching of the logs, and rests on stones in the corners. The cabin is abutted by two additions, one of them an Italianate-style, which is unusual for a rural area of Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Robinette Log Cabin stands on the eastern side of Valley Road near Cumberland.

This building originally consisted of a one and one-half story, two bays wide structure. Wall construction is of logs with "V" notching. The log walls are partially covered with vertical and horizontal planks nailed to the logs.

The original cabin rests on stones at the corners. The gable flank roof, covered with asphalt shingles, is extended to cover the porch on the southwest. Eaves consist of a simple overhanging cornice with a bed mould.

The offset entrance on the southwest is an old vertical board door with original hardware. Windows are pegged with six over six lights. One casement window is in the southeastern gable.

The first addition is a shed roofed board and batten kitchen that rests on wooden posts. An outside end corbeled brick chimney is on this addition.

A square Italianate addition, two stories tall and three bays wide, is on the northwest. Wall construction is a board and batten except for a covering of german siding on the northwest. This addition rests on a high random rubble stone foundation with a plain water table. Eaves consist of a bracketed box cornice and soffit on the northwest. An outside end cinderblock chimney is on the northeast. The entrance in the center of the northwest is a vertical board door with original hardware. Pedimented windows are pegged with six over six lights and wooden slipsills. One six over three light window is on the northeast side of this addition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Log Cabin was the most popular form of housing for western Maryland residents at the end of the eighteenth century, and the building of them continued well into the nineteenth century.⁽¹⁾ " Privacy was an unknown luxury; most families lived, cooked, worked, and slept within the confines of a single room." ⁽²⁾

This farm property was bought by Solomon Rice in 1860, and the log cabin was probably built shortly thereafter.⁽³⁾ The farm was known as " Little Valley Farm;" it was bought by Oliver and Alice Robinette in 1899, and has been owned by the Robinette family since then.⁽⁴⁾

The original log cabin has "V" notching of the logs, and it rests on stones at the corners. The cabin is abutted by a board and batten kitchen addition and a square Italianate addition- All the structures together present an unusual picture, and the Italianate-style addition is unique for a rural area of Allegany County.


