DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>Located at 7-9 Washington Street, the building stands on the northerly side of the street west of Cumberland Street in the Washington Street Historic District in Cumberland, Allegany County. Washington Street rises sharply to the west from Cumberland Street.</p> <p>The building is a two story brick structure with a low gable roof (roof line runs east/west) and a high basement. It is four bays long and three bays wide with closed end gables, three S-shaped tie rod end pieces between the first and second stories, and plain brick pilasters at the corners. A small pavilion with a closed gable roof is attached to the west end and has a doorway in the south side. An entrance with a neo-classical frontspiece is located on the facade (south side) in the eastern most bay of the high basement. This entrance is now the principal doorway.</p> <p>The principal window has double-hung wooden sashes with six-over-six lights on the second story, six-over-two lights on the first floor, and one-over-one lights on the basement level. The outer edges of the frames are rounded, a technique used commonly in the area in the 1830s and 1840s.</p> <p>The brick work of the exterior walls shows signs of alterations - doors and windows opened and/or closed. The interior appears to be remodeled in recent years mainly by the installation of wall paneling.</p> <p>A marble tablet on the Washington Street facade is inscripted "Maurice A. Healey Attorney and Counsellor at Law". This tablet dates probably from the late 1800s.</p>

<b>STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE</b>  <p style="margin-left: 40px;">This building was erected about 1839 by the "Masonic Lodge No. 6". It was dedicated on 4 July 1839 (Hansrate notes). About 1854 the Masons moved from the building and it had various uses in the following years. The "Dance Academy" occupied the structure for a while at which time it was known as "Terpischoreau Hall." In 1928 it was renovated for offices and is known today as the Professional Building.</p>





Since then it has served as a Dance Academy (Terpis-choreau Hall) offices of several railroads, Coal Mine and Lumber Companies.
