DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>400 Decatur Street stands on the westerly side of the street at the intersection of Davidson Street, northwest corner, about five blocks north of Baltimore Avenue (U.S. Route 40) in Cumberland, Allegany County, Maryland.</p> <p>The house is a mid nineteenth century brick structure with three stories, a stone foundation, and a three bay symmetrical facade (east side). The north and south end walls extend above the roof forming parapets. The south end wall has double internal chimneys. A two and a half story brick wing is attached to the back (west side) with a side porch and balcony along Davidson Street. The line of the low pitch roof, which is covered with metal stripes, runs north/south.</p> <p>The facade has a recessed entrance in the north bay of the first floor, two windows in the foundation, and a brick belt course just below the third story windows. The windows of the first and second story have double-hung wooden sashes with six-over-six lights. The third story windows are single wooden sashes with three lights each as are the basement windows. The entranceway has a wide board surround with a shouldered architrave with cornice. The doorway is recessed about five feet and has rectangular transom and sidelights. The door is wood frame with one large light, circa 1910. The entranceway is reached by a set of three sandstone steps and on to the doorway by wooden steps.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>400 Decatur Street, along with several similar buildings along Decatur Street, is important as representing a form of domestic Greek Revival architecture that was built in Cumberland in the mid nineteenth century. The common characteristics of these buildings are brick construction with stone foundations, extended end walls forming parapets, and wide surrounds at the entrances. Generally set tight to the sidewalk, these buildings are closely grouped forming rows but actually are detached and semi-detached double houses.</p> <p>It appears that 400 was built in about the early 1850s. Decatur Street was laid out about the mid 1840s as a part of Smith's Addition to Cumberland. The building was converted for apartments several years ago.</p>




