DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>The county building under discussion here stands on the east side of Prospect Square, north of Washington Street. The property is known as 11 East Prospect Square. The ground slopes to the northeast.</p> <p>The building is a circa 1927 brick structure with a hip roof and casement windows. The structure is rectangular in shape with a projection or pavilion on the facade (west side). The bricks are tan in color and laid in alternating rows of headers and stretchers, English Bond. There is a belt above the second story windows that is formed by bricks upright with the stretcher side out. This belt ties into a circular pattern of bricks in the gable of the pavilion. The window sills are stone. The roof is covered with tile. Underneath the overhang of the roof are a narrow cornice and brackets. An external chimney is on the north side.</p> <p>The facade of the building is symmetrical with the pavilion in the center bay. The pavilion is flanked on each side by one window opening on the first floor and two on the second floor. A stone belt runs along the front under the windows and includes the sills. A set of steps leading to the basement are on the south side of the facade and are screened by a brick wall the height of the stone belt course. The entrance is recessed in the pavilion. The six panel door is flanked by side lights and has a transom above.</p> <p>The interior has a short entrance hall on the first floor with the staircase on the easterly end. There is a large room on the northerly side of the hall and a smaller room and service rooms on the southerly side. The decorative detailing is 1920ish "academic".</p> <p>The building is in good shape and the basic structure remains intact.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house at 11 East Prospect Square is significant for its architecture, its history, and its preservation through an adaptive use. The building is representative of an architectural style that was popular in the first third of the twentieth century. The design is eclectic combining features of several styles - classical, Victorian and modern.

The house was erected about 1926-1927. The east side of Prospect Square is described in the 1925 edition of Polk's Cumberland City Directory as having no houses. In the 1927 edition, 11 East Prospect Square is listed as the residence of W. Bladen Lowndes, Jr., who was associated with the Second National Bank in Cumberland. Tradition says that Tasker and Elizabeth Lowndes had the house built for the use of their nephew W. Bladen Lowndes, Jr.

The building sets on a part of lot number 97 as shown on the 1806 plot map of Cumberland. In 1856 the Lowndes family acquired the property. Upon the death of Miss Elizabeth Lowndes in the early 1960's the property was sold. The land on which 11 East Prospect Square stands was purchased by the Central Assembly of God about 1964 and sold to the Allegany County Commissioners in 1968. The building is presently used by the Cooperative Extension of the University of Maryland.


