	<small>DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE</small>
<p>Located at 128-130 Baltimore Street, the Schwarzenback Building stands on the northerly side of Baltimore Street, near the middle of the block formed by Centre and George Streets, in the central business district of Cumberland, Allegany County.</p> <p>The building is an early twentieth century masonry structure with three stories plus a mansard and has a commercial front on the street level, a set of five double casement windows on the second and third floor, and four large dormers with double-hung wooden sashes with one-over-one lights and segmental pediments in the mansard. The commercial front consists of a center entrance with large display windows, one of which is an island, and, judging from a circa 1923 photograph of the building, may be original although the area directly above with the "Schwarzenback's Since 1869" in applied letters dates from the past decade. The spandrel area between the second and third floors appears to be decorated with iron panels with five circles spaced evenly across the length. Above the third floor windows is a series of five arches in iron. The cornice consists of a large shelf-like form with scroll brackets, one at each end. Below the brackets are large decorative stone sculptures. The corners of the building are made of dressed stone. The mansard roof is covered with slate shingles laid in a diamond pattern.</p> <p>The building, occupied solely by Schwarzenback's clothing store, appears to be structurally sound.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			
<p>Tradition says that the Schwarzenback Building was erected for George Schwarzenback (1847-19--) and his son, John Schwarzenback, who conducted a clothing store in Cumberland under the name of Schwarzenback and Son. The firm moved into the building at 128-132 Baltimore Street in 1912. (<u>History of Allegany County</u>, p.719)</p> <p>Architecturally, this building is unusual for Cumberland. Most of the buildings that still stand along Baltimore Street, the principal business street, show a strong Romanesque influence in the arcaded facades. The Schwarzenback Building is more Beau-Arts or classically influenced although it contains an arcaded effect above the third floor windows, almost hidden below the cornice. The bold mansard roof, the type of sculpture below the brackets, the segmental pediments on the dormers gives the building a stronger Beaux-Arts feel than one of the Romanesque.</p> <p>The Schwarzenback firm was founded in 1869 by George Schwarzenbach, a German emigrant. His son John joined the business about 1888, (Biographies of father and son are available in <u>History of Allegany County</u> (1923), pages 718-720.)</p> <p>Note: An early photograph of the building can be found in <u>History of Allegany County</u> between pages 120 and 121. The photograph is not dated.</p>


