The single-family dwelling at 507 Dilley Street in Cumberland, Allegany County, MD is not eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places, nor is located within a National Register-eligible or listed historic district.

Built in the first quarter of this century, the two-story, three-bay frame dwelling is a representative example of domestic building forms from the period. The house is set upon a low foundation, is covered with a low gable roof and features a single-story front porch with turned columns. The dwelling lacks the architectural distinctiveness necessary to qualify it for listing under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past and thus does not meet Criteria A or C. The building is not located in any historic district listed on or determined eligible for listing the National Register of Historic Places.



