The Kerch House is a well preserved example of a typical miner's dwelling constructed by the Maryland Mining Company. Because of its substantial size (the house contains ten rooms and three fireplaces), it is probable that the building was constructed for a company foreman or a superintendent. As is typical "company housing", the Kerch House is a frame dwelling that has been covered with clapboards and rests on a high stone foundation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Kerch Miner's House is located on old Rt. 40 in Eckhart, Allegany County.

The Kerch house is a two story, five bay wide, rectangular frame dwelling that has been covered with clapboards. A one story shed roof addition abuts the main block on the south side. The entire structure rests on a low stone foundation. The roof is gabled and is covered with tin. Windows in the structure are double hung, pegged, wooden sash frames with a combination of two-over-two and six-over-six lights. Two dormer windows are located on the north facade. The main entrance is located on the north side and features a vertically paneled door with original hardware and a transom light. A shed roofed porch is also located on the north facade. It is supported by chamfered columns and a ballustrade. Three original, corbeled brick chimneys are located in the interior of the building.

The interior of the house has been altered somewhat, however it originally contained ten rooms. The six rooms located on the first floor were divided by a central hall and staircase. Three fireplaces were also located on the first floor while the second story contained four rooms.

The Kerch House is in fair condition and retains much of its fabric and appearance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Kerch House, located in Eckhart is a well preserved example of a 19th century dwelling constructed by the Maryland Mining Company. Because of its substantial size (the house contains ten rooms and three fireplaces), it is probable that the building was constructed for a company foreman or super intendent.

The Maryland Mining Company developed the village of Eckhart Mines in the middle of the 19th century. By 1852 the town had a population of 800 people.¹


