The Stephens' Stonehouse is located on Upper Bank Street in Mount Savage. Moses Stephens built this house sometime between 1852 and 1857. In a deed dated 1857, which transfers the property to James B. Thomas, it is stated that on the property "there is one stone dwelling house." Unlike the other George's Creek communities where stone was rarely used as building material, sandstone was often used in Mount Savage for homes. The building originally consisted of a rectangular one and one-half story, three bays wide structure. An addition on the southeast made it an "L" shaped building.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This stone house is located on Upper Bank Street in Mount Savage.

The building originally consisted of a rectangular one and one-half story, three bay wide structure. A gable roofed stone addition on the southeast makes the building an "L" shaped structure. Wall construction is of sandstone rubble with rough quoins on the corners. The walls are 27 inches thick. The gable roof is covered with tar paper. The original building had two interior end brick chimneys. One has been removed. An inside end chimney is on the addition.

The main entrance is located in the center of the northwestern facade. Windows of the first floor are pegged six over six light sashes. Half-story windows are two over two light sashes and six light casements. A hip roofed porch is in the corner of the "L" shaped building. A porch on the northwest has been removed.

The main section is divided into two rooms. A boxed stair runs along the rear wall. The owner reports that no original interior woodwork remains. (Interior inspection was not permitted 10/82).
