Although the county's public school system was established in 1865, it was not until the 1870's that adequate schoolhouses were built. In the mining area many schools were built on land donated by the mining companies. The Dutch Hollow School was built during the 1870's. The building has been partially remodeled but one remaining feature of interest is the large brick chimney of white glazed brick, a local product. Although the school was closed in the 1950's it serves as a reminder of the progress of education in Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Dutch Hollow School is located northwest of Mount Savage at the intersection of Blank Road and Dutch Hollow Road.

The building consists of a one story rectangular frame structure with german siding. It rests on a replaced low cinderblock foundation with a plain water table. Eaves consist of a fascia and frieze with brackets. The gable flank roof is covered with asphalt shingles. An original chimney of white glazed brick with a corbeled cap is located outside end. All windows and doors have been replaced. A central gabled portico is on the northeastern facade.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The public school system of Allegany County was established in 1865. (1) A state report of that year described teachers as "ignorant" and schoolhouses as "very inferior." (2) Despite the county's high rate of illiteracy, Georges' Creek miners "registered a higher rate of literacy than laborers in town or upper George's Creek region, including Mount Savage, reported that in 1865 there were fifteen schools houses and one thousand and three hundred students in the district. (4) More substantial schoolhouses were built with funds raised by students and citizens on lands donated by the coal companies. (5) "Once the building program really began, the mining areas were well looked after." (6)

One schoolhouse erected in the 1870's during the schoolbuilding program was the Dutch Hollow School near Mount Savage. The land on which it stands was eventually acquired by adverse possession, the Board of Education had "continuously openly, and notoriously used and occupied said property for the period of at least seventy years." (7) One interesting feature of this long frame building is the large original chimney of white glazed brick, a local product. Although the school was closed in the early 1950's when a modern high school was built nearby. The Dutch Hollow School stands as a reminder of the importance of education in the lives of the miners of the Georges Creek area.


