DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This dwelling is two stories tall and three bays wide on the southwestern-facing facade. Wall construction is frame covered with asbestos shingles. The gables are covered with imbricated wooden shingles. The building rests on a high stone foundation which has been sheathed in cement. The gabled roof is covered with standing seam tin and metal snowbirds. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, bed mould, soffit and frieze. A shed roofed frame addition abuts the northeastern elevation of the house.

A hip roofed porch on the facade has turned posts with decorative bracketing. The railing and floor of the porch have been replaced. Windows are plain 1/1 sashes. The entrance in the center of the facade includes a one light transom and an original door with one light, original hardware, and a decorated panel.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Condry Frame House was one of several properties owned by George Porter along Frog Hollow Road, now known as Piney Mountain Road. Porter was a land owner who leased properties, probably to miners, during the 1890's. (Liber 164, Folio 479-480) The house is typical of houses built in the Georges Creek mining region during the latter half of the 19th century.


