The Wilson farmhouse is located on the northern side of Dutch Hollow Road near Mount Savage. The rectangular building is two stories tall, three bays wide and two bays deep. The frame house is covered with german siding and insul brick siding.

Members of the Mallin family built this house in 1900 for a daughter. It is typical of turn-of-the-century rural architecture in Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Wilson Farmhouse is located on the northern side of Dutch Hollow Road near Mount Savage. The rectangular building is three bays wide and two stories tall. Wall construction is frame with german siding covered with insul brick siding. It rests on a high stone foundation of random rubble with raised joints. The gabled roof is covered with tarpaper. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould and returns. A shed roofed frame addition on the northwestern elevation has no apparent foundation.

A hip roofed porch on the facade has capped tapered wooden posts. A smaller porch on the northeastern elevation of the addition has a gabled roof supported by square posts. Windows are pegged 2/2 sashes with wooden logsills and drip moldings. Windows of the addition are plain six over six light sashes. The main entrance is offset to the west of the facade had a drip moulding. A four panel, door has original hardware. The side entrance on the northeast includes a three panel, one light door with a decoratively spindled screen door. An inside end chimney on the northwest has a stack of white glazed brick with a corbeled cap. Decorative diamond-shaped ventilators in the gables are sawed with the date of construction. A saddle-notched log outbuilding constructed since 1930 is a one story rectangular structure with a gabled roof and no apparent foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Wilson Farmhouse was built in 1900 by members of the Mallin family for a daughter. (interview with Mr. Arthur Winebrenner 10/15/80) The house is typical of turn of the century rural housing in Allegany County. The frame building is two stories tall and three bays wide and is covered with german siding and insul brick siding. An inside end brick chimney is constructed of white glazed brick, a specialty item manufactured by the Mount Savage Enameled Brick Company.
