Based on the information provided by SCS (the Maryland Inventory does not include a form or photos), this property is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places. The property was identified as a "minimal site" in the Coal Region Survey. The property consists of a partially collapsed brick building originally 2 stories, constructed of hollow core brick on a concrete foundation, approximately 20 feet by 40 feet. Sections of the walls are still standing, but all are in poor condition. There is no roof. The building is said to have housed mules and ponies that were used in mining operations around World War I. The Big Vein Coal Company mining operations ended at the site in 1927. Available information does not suggest that the property was associated with any significant event or person or that it is significant in terms of design. In addition, the property lacks the integrity necessary to convey significance in these areas. The property is not located in any known historic district.


