DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Perry Log House is located on the western side of Route 55 near Clarysville. The one and one-half story dwelling is three bays wide on the facade (eastern elevation), and one bay deep. Walls of the house are log covered with vertical planks and insul brick siding. The building rests on stones laid at the corners. Glazed tile blocks and cinderblocks have been placed between the stones which support the building. The gabled roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Exterior cinderblock chimneys have been added on the northern and southern elevations.

A hip roofed porch on the facade has square wooden posts. Windows of the house are 3/1 and 1/1 sashes. An entrance which is located off set to the north of the center of the facade includes a door of one light and two panels. An entrance on the southern end of the western elevation includes a door of three lights and three panels.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Perry Log House was built by James W. Perry in 1911. Mr. Perry was a miner who worked in mines at Montel, Pompey Smash (Vale Summit), and Hoffman. (interview)

The one and one-half story house is a relatively late example of log construction for Allegany County. Log houses were popular as an affordable form housing in western Maryland during the late 19th century and throughout the 19th century.


