Old Plank Road, Barrelville
Ca. 1812

The Wagon Maker's Shop is located on the Old Plank Road (a main thoroughfare during the first half of the 19th century) and was used primarily for the repair and building of wagons. The building itself which is of frame construction is set into a hillside and is supported by a high stone foundation. In the original structure huge doors were located at the rear of the structure so that the wagons could be pushed in and out of the building.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Wagon Maker's House is located on the east side of the Old Plank Road, north of Barrelville, Allegany County near the Pennsylvania line.

The house consists of a two story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped frame structure. A two story wing with shed roof abuts the main block on the rear, east side and forms a "saltbox" shape. The building is constructed of simple verticle boards with no battens, and has been covered with insul brick and aluminum siding. The entire facade is supported by a high stone foundation which extends to the top of the first story level. The roof of the structure is gabled and covered with asphalt shingles. Eaves of the roof exhibit a plain boxed cornice. Windows in the building include pegged, double hung, wooden sash frames with six-over-six and three-over-one lights. Most windows feature plain trim, however, several have a wooden shelf. The main entrance is located on the front, west side, and features a replaced paneled door with plain trim. A three bay end porch is placed on the front side of the house. The porch includes a hipped roof and entablature supported by square columns with cushion capitals and brick bases. Three corbeled brick chimneys are located on the inside ends of both gables and the rear of the house.

The house is structurally sound but has been drastically altered when renovated to serve as a house instead of a wagon makers shop.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Wagon Maker's Shop is located on the Old Plank Road and was probably constructed during the first quarter of the 19th century. The building has been altered somewhat since its original construction; however, it retains much of its original fabric and appearance. Because the building is set into the hillside and the foundation is extremely high the second floor is at ground level at the rear of the building. In original structure, huge doors were located across the rear and wagons were pushed into the building through the rear doors.

In an era when the population was continually pushing westward, the wagon maker's trade was an important one. This particular shop was located on a main thoroughfare (the Old Plank Road) which ran between Sommerset, Pennsylvania and Baltimore. In addition, it was located next to the Plank Road Tavern, a prime location, since wagons and state coaches would undoubtedly have needed to be repaired while the drivers stayed at the inn.
