DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Carry Tipple is located on Rt. 36 between Corriganville and Barrelville, Allegany County.

The tipple is basically a one story, rectangular shaped structure whose wall construction is of horizontal boards braced by two by four's. The structure is supported by a low cement foundation. The roof is gable front; original covered with tin sheets and exhibits exposed rafter ends along its eaves. The structure stands slanted downward with main entrance facing west mounted with its original hardware for releasing the coal.

The structure is in fair condition and retains most of its original appearance.

This tipple was erroneously surveyed as a coal tipple, however it served as a stone quarry tipple. (c. 1950 phtograph in circa file, Special Collections, Frostburg State College Library). It has been demolished since the date of this survey. (c. 1980)

This coal tipple is in the Georges' Creek Valley area and is located on land that once belonged to the Parker Vein Coal Company with its mining village of Barrelville. 1.

With mining being such a major industry in Allegany County during the 1800's and even though this tipple is fairly recent in construction; with few improvements; it is an excellent example of one of the ways in which coal was loaded during the late 1800's. 2.


