

AL-V-B-092
Huffman Farm House
Cash Valley Road
Ca. 1850's

Because of similar features on its exterior, this brick structure laid in American Common Bond is one of at least three houses located in Cash Valley constructed during the 1850's featuring wide soffits, boxed cornices with return ends and using a six to one variation in the brick work. (See AL-V-B-091, AL-V-B-095.) This probably means that all of them were built by the same builder. This house displays two original brick chimneys with corbeled caps and original slate roof. An umbrage porch located on the west side of the house is an unusual type porch for this area.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Huffman Farm is located on the Cash Valley Road near La Vale, Allegany County.

The building basically consists of a two story, three bay wide "T" shaped structure. A rear, second story addition with novelty siding abuts the building on the west side. The main part of the building is brick wall construction, laid in American Common Bond with six to one variation. Wall features are plain. The building is supported by a high, stone foundation featuring a stone, beveled water table. The roof of the building is both gable front and gable flank. The covering is the original slate shingles. Located on the roof are snow boards. In the peak of each gable is a circular decorated ventilator surrounded by a round brick arch. Eaves of the roof exhibit original boxed cornices with wide soffits. Windows in the house are pegged, double hung, with wooden sash frames and six-over-six lights. Window trim features flat brick arches over each window and slipsills at the bases. There are two chimneys in the house. Both are original, brick with corbeled caps. One is located inside end, the other is interior. The main entrance is located southeast which features a four paneled door with verticle boards. The building contains two porches. On the west side of the house an umbrage porch which is three-bay wide and supported by four wooden chamfered posts. The front porch is an open, three bay wide porch supported by five chamfered posts with brackets and is covered by a shed roof.

The house is structurally sound with moderate remodeling, but still maintains most of its original appearance.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Although Allegany County's mines and industries attracted much attention and publicity, "the true wealth of the area was farm products" that came from farms like this one. ¹ Even late in the nineteenth century a majority of the county's residents lived on farms. ²

The Huffman Farm House is one of three farm houses in the Cash Valley that were constructed in a very similar style during the 1850's. (See AL-V-B-095 and AL-V-B-091) All three of these farm houses were constructed with original wide soffits, eaves featuring boxed cornices with returns, and brick laid in a variation of six to one. This house also includes two original brick chimneys with corbeled caps and original slate roof. An unbrage porch located on the west side of the house is an unusual feature for this area.

Huffman Farm House displays architectural details which are indicative of the level of economic prosperity enjoyed by farmers in the area during the last century. Having retained much of its original appearance this farm house remains an architectural document of a way of life once found in the rural areas of Allegany County.


