DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hughes Log Mansion is located on the Shortest Day Road, outside of LaVale, Allegany County.

The building basically consists of a two and one-half story, four bay wide, rectangular shaped log structure. A two-story frame rear addition abuts the main building on the northwest side covered with shed roof. The entire outside of the whole building is covered with insul brick. Wall features are plain. The building is supported by a high, stone foundation with no apparent water table. The roof of the building is gable flank, covered with asphalt shingles; replaced. Eaves of the roof exhibit a wide soffit which is original. Windows in the building are pegged, narrow, double hung, with wooden sash frames and two-over-two and six-over-six lights. Window trim features lugsills covered with insul brick. There are two brick chimneys in the building, both of which are located interior. One is original and one is replaced; with a cement block cap. There are two porches. One is half closed, half open with stone foundation: supported by wooden posts and covered with shed roof. The southeast facade features a two story veranda with balcony (enclosed with fancy wood railing) supported by square wooden columns. The main entrance faces southeast with a four paneled door with verticle boards.

The building is structurally sound with drastic remodeling and retains practically nothing of its original appearance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hughes Log Mansion is a large building. Originally a two and one-half story, four bay wide, rectangular shaped structure made of log construction. The building features a second story, four bay wide verandah, and eaves of the roof exhibit a wide soffit.

The Hughes Log Mansion is the largest of a group of log structures located in the Cash Valley. Due to its location it was probably a farm house and was constructed during the 1870's. Local farmers relied upon abundant forests to provide cheap and practical material for home building.

Subsequent construction of a two-story rear end addition and a covering of insul brick have altered the appearance of the structure greatly. Although once reflecting a level of prosperity and cultural awareness of local farmers the building now retains little of its original appearance.


