Cessna Frame House

This frame residence was built by Thomas B. Cessna in 1907. The property was originally part of a large tract of land north and east of Mount Savage known as the "Mount Savage farm." The building was designed with asymmetrical composition and varied forms associated with the Queen Anne's Style. Although the building lacks the variety of texture and color of the Queen Anne's style, it stands as a reminder of the cultural awareness of rural residents of early twentieth century Allegany County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Cessna Frame House is located on the northern side of Route 36 approximately one mile east of Mount Savage.

This building is two and one-half stories tall and five bays wide on the south. Wall construction is frame with German siding. It rests on a low stone foundation of random rock-faced ashlar with a plain water table. The roof is pyramidal with gabled extension on the north and east, all covered with asphalt shingles. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, and frieze with returns on the northern gable end. A gable dormer on the west has similar eaves. Two projecting two storied bays on the south and east have pointed bay roofs. One inside end chimney of white glazed brick has a corbeled cap.

The main entrance, offset on the southern facade, consists of a pedimented transom and an original door of three panels and one rectangular light. Two similar entrances are on the north and east. Windows are pegged and pedimented one over one light sashes with wooden lugsills. Pointed arched windows are located in a pair on the western dormer and singly on the northern gable end. One semicircular arched window is located on the western facade. This stained glass window has fluted and capped jambs and a wooden "keystone". A wraparound, hip roofed veranda supported by replaced square brick pillars on stone pedestals is on the south and east. A shed roofed porch with decorative turned posts is on the north.

SPECIFIC DATES 1907 BUILDER/ARCHITECT T.B. Cessna and Harvey Poole

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This frame residence was built by Thomas Benton Cessna in 1907. Referred to as "the Cessna Home Place" in recent deeds, the property was originally part of a large tract of land north and east of Mount Savage known as "the Mount Savage Farm." (1)

Cessna purchased a parcel of the tract from the Kuykendall family in May on 1907 for \$350.00.(2) In October of that same year an improvement on Cessna's property was assessed for the first time at \$1,000.00. (3) In his will Cessna also mentioned other tracts of land including one known as "the slaughterhouse property", evidence that he probably was a farmer. (4)

The building was designed with assymetrical composition and varied forms associated with the Queen Anne's Style. A pyramidal roof line has gabled extension, peaked roofs on projecting bays on the south and east, and a gabled dormer. Most windows are rectangular but three pointed arch windows are located on the second and one-half floor, and one semicircular arched stained glass window is located between floors in the stairway. A hip roofed wraparound veranda on the south and east has replaced posts. Although the building lacks the variety of texture and color of the Queen Anne's Style, it stands as a reminder of the cultural awareness of rural residents of Allegany County early in the twentieth century.


