DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Spiker Brick House is located on Railroad Street near the Route 36 intersection in Midland, Allegany County.

The Spiker House is a rectangular, two story, four bay wide brick structure that has been covered with aluminum siding. The house sits on a low stone foundation with a beveled water table. The roof is gabled with a soffit and has been covered with replaced asphalt shingles. Windows in the house have been replaced and now consist of double hung, wooden sash frames with one over one lights. The main entrance is located in a single story gable roofed addition which abuts the main block on its southeastern side. Both the entrance and the hardware have been replaced. A single, original corbeled, brick chimney is located in the interior of the building.

The Spiker House is in good condition but has been altered greatly from its original appearance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Spiker Brick House is typical of the type of housing constructed by the coal companies in the latter half of the 19th century. Unfortunately, the building has been greatly altered since its original construction, and it is difficult to determine exactly what the original home might have looked like. In all probability the Spiker Brick House was what is known as a "block" or a two family dwelling which was constructed by the coal companies in the mid to late 19th century. The Spiker house differs from the majority of blocks in the area in that it is constructed of brick. However, it does have the standard central chimney providing each family with two fireplaces and probably originally had two front entrances which have since been removed to make room for a new addition. A "block" provided each family with three rooms on the first floor and one on the second. Double houses built by the Midland Coal and Iron Company in 1856 cost about \$400.00.¹



SECTION VI QUADRANGLE B


