The Francis House is a large brick dwelling that is a variation of one of the most popular Italianate designs in America. It was probably constructed in 1872 for John Helber and is one of the most elegant houses in Lonaconing dating from the latter half of the 19th century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Francis Brick House is located on the east side of Church Street in Lonaconing, Allegany County.

The Francis House is a two story, three bay wide, rectangular building constructed of brick laid in American Common Bond. The western half of the structure rests on a high stone foundation. Because of the fact that the building was constructed on a hill, the basement is at ground level. On the eastern side, the foundation is at ground level and constructed of brick. The roof is hipped and has been covered with replaced asphalt shingles. It has a wide soffit supported by pairs of brackets and a frieze. On the ridge of the roof there are two small gabled dormers facing east/west. Windows in the structure are double hung pegged wooden sash frames with two over two lights and plain trim. The main entrance is located on the west facade and features two horizontally paneled doors with transom lights placed side by side. Both doors are covered by a three bay, hipped-roof entrance porch that is supported by chamfered columns and a balustrade. A second three bay end porch is located at the rear of the building. Two, original, corbeled brick chimneys are located in the interior of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Francis Brick House was probably constructed in approximately 1872 by John Helber.¹ The house is a variation of one of the most popular Italianate designs in America.² "The house is shaped like a cube; the roof projects several feet and rests on large, decorative brackets. Atop the center of the roof sits a lookout, now usually called a cupola."³ Because of its double doors, it is possible that the building was constructed to house two superintendent's families rather than to be a single family dwelling.


