The Hughes Shingle Roof Log House is believed to be a private house built circa 1840 by an early miner to the George's Creek area. The original portion of the house consists of a one room, one and a half story, two bay wide log structure. The log house was a popular form of housing in the early settlement period of Allegany County. The facade was easy and inexpensive to construct and was extremely sturdy.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hughes Shingle Roof Log House is located on the south side of Jackson Hollow Road, near Lonaconing, Allegany County at the intersection of Charlestown Road.

The facade was constructed in two parts. The original portion consists of a one and a half story, two bay wide log structure, while the western wing is made up of a two story, two bay wide, rectangular frame facade. The entire house is covered with weatherboarding and is supported by a low stone foundation with plain water table. The roof of the structure is gabled on both portions; however, a facial parapet is placed on the front of the frame addition. The roof of the frame portion is covered by replaced asphalt materials, while the log portion roof exhibits the original wooden shingles which are partially covered with tin sheeting. Windows in the structure include pegged double hung wooden sash frames with one over one, two over two and six over six lights with plain trim. Two original entrances are placed on the front northeastern side of the house, and these exhibit the original verticle paneled doors with plain trim. The entrances are covered with a three bay end porch with hipped roof. The roof is supported by square columns with brackets around the porch eaves, and balustrade on the porch floor. Two original corbeled brick chimneys are found on the inside end of the log portion.

The house presently serves as a residence for the Hughes family and is in need of repair.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hughes Shingle Roof Log House is believed to be a private house built in the mid 19th century by an early miner to the George's Creek area. The house originally was a one room log cabin; however, a frame addition was made to the house circa 1890. The log structure was a popular form of housing in the early settlement period of Allegany County. The facade was inexpensive to build, easy to construct and extremely sturdy. Years after their construction, many of these houses were covered with a variety of sidings. Of particular interest on this house is the presence of the original split wood shingles. The roof had been covered with tin, but on large patches of the roof the metal has deteriorated; leaving the wooden shingles exposed.

The house is in deteriorated condition; however, it remains an architectural reminder of a way of life once found in Allegany Co.


