This board and batten building is an outbuilding of the Shaw Farm in Rawlings. The farm was established around the mid-nineteenth century by Henry Hutson. This particular building probably housed tenant farmers or farm hands. Later in the nineteenth century the farm was owned by Major Alexander Shaw an officer of the Union Arm's Potomac Home Brigade.

The "T" shaped building is one and one-half stories tall and three bays wide. The gable flank roof is covered with ribbed tin with eaves consisting of a cornice and bedmould.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building is located on the Shaw Farm in Rawlings.

The "T" shaped building is one and one-half stories tall and three bays wide. Wall construction is of board and beveled batten. It rests on a low stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with ribbed tin. Eaves consist of a cornice and bed moulding. A replaced cement block chimney is located in the center of the building. A shed roofed frame addition on the southwest resting on wooden posts has two over two light sash windows.

Two entrances offset on the northwestern and northeastern facades each have four paneled wooden doors. Windows of the first floor are pedimented six over six lights with wooden lugsills. One and one-half floor windows are three over six light sashes. Shed roofed porches with square wooden posts are on the northwestern and northeastern facades.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This board and batten house is located on the Shaw Farm in Rawlings.

The house is an outbuilding of the Shaw Farm and was most likely inhabited by tenant farmers. It was probably built in the mid-nineteenth century when the farm was owned by Henry Hutson. (1)

The "T" shaped building is one and one-half stories tall and three bays wide. The gable flank roof is covered with ribbed tin. Eaves consist of a cornice and bed moulding. Two entrances offset on the north-western and northeastern facades each have four paneled wooden doors.


