In 1830 the tract of land call "Ethiopia and the Isles" was patented to John N. Smith. He most likely built this log house shortly afterwards. In 1884 his heirs sold it along with 897 acres of land to David Evans. The house originally consisted of a one and one-half story three bays wide structure. The log walls are covered with weatherboard and insul brick siding.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This log house originally consisted of a one and one-half story three bays wide structure. Wall construction is of logs covered with weatherboard and insul brick siding. It rests on a high stone foundation of random rubble with no apparent water table. The gable flank roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Eaves consist of a cornice and frieze. One brick chimney located outside end on an addition is of glazed white brick. A gabled frame addition abuts the original on the southern gabled end. A shed roofed porch on the western facade has been enclosed. Windows are pegged six over six light sashes with wooden lugsills.
