The ruins of the Consolidation Coal Company Mine #17 operation contain three prominent remains:

1. The brick walls and stack of the motor barn and an adjacent foundation of the substation are situated on the south side of Klondike Rd.
2. 200 feet southwest of the motor barn is the mine entrance which has collapsed; only the impression is visible.
3. 700 feet northwest of the motor barn and across Woodland Creek is a small brick magazine.

There are several foundations of mine related structures and gob piles scattered throughout the area; however the overgrowth of vegetation has made it difficult to discern the layout of the mine operation. (see enclosed copy of Insurance Map, Consolidation No. 7 and 17, Lord, MD, Feb. 1932.)

On September 25, 1981, this site was revisited. It was noted that the walls and stack of the motor barn have been torn down or fallen in.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The site of Consolidation Coal Company Mine #17 is typical of coal mine related ruins found in the Georges Creek Region.

Mine #17 opened in 1925 and closed in 1950. It was operated by Consolidation Coal Company from 1925 to 1944 and from 1944 to 1950 by the Consolidation Fuel Co., Inc.

Consolidation Coal Company, organized in 1864, had its roots in the Georges Creek coal mining region. By the turn of the century, it was the largest bituminous coal company in the eastern United States.

Consol's Mine #17 was a drift mine working a small vein of coal known as the Tyson or Sewickly seam. (A drift mine is a horizontal mine opening.) Ventilation was produced by an electrically driven fan. By the early 1930s, the mine was completely mechanized. Mine #17's peak year for coal production came in 1931 when 142 men produced 100, 517 net tons of coal.



CONSOLIDATION NO. 7 & 17


